Long-term Bonalbo resident John Tart could be described as a man of vision; although, it's perhaps a term that wouldn't sit too comfortably with the softly-spoken gentleman.

John has been a long-term advocate for improving the health facilities at Bonalbo, and is currently the President of the Save Our Services (SOS) Committee, and community representative for the MPS project.

When the former Bonalbo Community Health building was demolished in 2016 to make way for construction of the new Bonalbo MPS, John requested that timbers from the building be rescued so that he could 'up-cycle' them into furniture for the Residential Aged Care (RAC) facility.

The chair is currently being oiled and will be handed over to the Bonalbo MPS later this month.
