

Countdown to MPS completion



Work is powering ahead at the MPS with the remaining sections of construction scheduled for completion by the end of May.

There has been significant progress despite the closure of the facility during the January bushfires and the current coronavirus pandemic. Major milestones include:

- refurbishment of the existing Residential Aged Care wing
- extensive landscaping and community garden
- a new main entrance access road and car park
- demolition of the old hospital buildings

The building will be handed over from the contractor to Murrumbidgee Local Health District when the remaining works are complete.
