

New Health Service garden taking shape

The recent warm weather has seen the new gardens around the Health Service spring to life, including the Aboriginal garden, designed in consultation with local Aboriginal community members. It incorporates seating for visitors, and a design reflective of the Harden landscape complemented by hardy local plant selections.

Roses have been a part of the Health Service garden for many years and staff were keen to see this tradition continue. Cuttings were taken during winter of roses planted in the garden bed in front of the old theatre building and 24 have found a new home at the front of the new facility. The project was undertaken with the assistance of The Harden Nursery.

An enormous crane towered over the Health Service site in September as new staff accommodation units were lowered onto the grounds.



The three one-bedroom self contained units are now connected to services, furnished and ready for hospital staff to move in early November.
