The build is well and truly on track, with the majority of the frames up, and roof sheeting installed on some parts of the new health service building, as seen in the below photo.

Work is also occurring on the existing Lilliane Brady Village, to connect to mains infrastructure and in-ground services, with concrete to be poured on the extension in February.



Local drought funds raised

Beating the heat on site

It's summer and it's hot! To manage the heat risk
